AND WHEREAS the High Court upon perusing the petition and memorandum of grounds filed herein and upon hearing the arguments of Sri Yadavalli Ramesh Advocate for the Petitioners and of Public Prosecutor for the Respondent No.1, directed issue of notice to the Respondent No.2 herein to show cause as to why this CRIMINAL PETITION should not be admitted.

Petition under Section 528 of BNSS praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to stay of all further proceedings in FIR.No.30 of 2026, dated 17-04-2026 on the file of the Ipuru Police Station, registered for the offence U/Ss. 85, 351(2) of BNS and Sec.3 and 4 of D.P.Act, against the Petitioners/Accused No. 1 to 3, Pending disposal of CRLP No.3366 of 2026, on the file of the High Court.

The Court made the following: ORDER

“Heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and the learned Assistant Public Prosecutor.

Issue notice to respondent No.2.

The learned counsel for the petitioners is permitted to take out personal notice on respondent No.2 and file proof to that effect.

Respondent No.2 has lodged a complaint against her in-laws. The marriage between Petitioner No.1 and Respondent No.2 was performed about 13 years ago.

Considering the nature of the allegations levelled against the petitioners, the matter is referred to mediation.

Ms.Kesava Kumari Nemala, learned trained Mediator, is appointed as the Mediator in this case.

The Secretary, High Court Legal Services Committee, is directed to issue necessary proceedings in that regard.

The fee for the Mediator shall be fixed at a later point of time.

The petitioners and Respondent No.2 are directed to appear before the learned Mediator on 08.05.2026 or on any other convenient date for the parties and the Mediator.

The Station House Officer concerned is hereby directed to drive the parties before the Mediator for amicable settlement.

Post the matter after Summer Vacation-2026, for Mediator's report.

Until the conclusion of the mediation proceedings, there shall be a stay of all further proceedings in FIR.No.30 of 2026 on the file of Ipuru Police Station."
