Dr.YLR,J <u>CrI.P.No.3395 of 2026</u> Heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and the learned Assistant Public Prosecutor. Issue notice to respondent No.2. The learned counsel for the petitioners is permitted to take out personal notice on respondent No.2 and file proof to that effect. The petitioner/Accused No. 1 is the husband of respondent No. 2. Petitioners/Accused Nos. 2 and 3 are the in-laws of respondent No.2. Petitioner/Accused No. 4 is the sister-in-law of respondent No.2. Petitioner/Accused No. 4 is residing in Hyderabad, while Petitioners/Accused Nos.2 and 3 are residing in Visakhapatnam. Petitioner/Accused No.3 is suffering from carcinoma. Petitioner/Accused Nos.1 and 2 were earlier residing in Jharkhand. Respondent No.2 left the company of	Contd...

	petitioner No.1; therefore, petitioner No.1 filed a petition for restitution of conjugal rights before the Court in Jharkhand, which was decreed ex-parte. Subsequently, respondent No.2 filed a divorce petition before the Court at Avanigadda. Thereafter, respondent No. 2 filed a complaint against the petitioners alleging that they committed offences punishable under Section 498-A of 'the IPC' and Sections 3 and 4 of the Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961. Considering the entire facts and circumstances of the case, the matter is referred to mediation. Mr. Isukapatla Madhu Babu, learned trained Mediator, is appointed as the Mediator in this case. The Secretary, High Court Legal Services Committee, is directed to issue necessary proceedings in that regard. The fee for the Mediator shall be fixed at a later point of time. The petitioners and Respondent No.2 are directed to appear before the learned Mediator on 08.05.2026 or on any other convenient date for the parties and the Mediator. The Petitioner No.1 is granted liberty to appear before the mediator through virtual mode; similarly, Petitioner No.3 is also granted the same liberty. The learned Magistrate of the Trial Court and the Station House Officer concerned is hereby directed to drive the parties before the Mediator for amicable settlement.	Contd...
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Post the matter after Summer Vacation-2026, for Mediator's report.

Until the conclusion of the mediation proceedings, there shall be a stay of all further proceedings in C.C.No.273 of 2024 on the file of the learned Judicial First Class Magistrate-Cum-Junior Civil Judge at Avanigadda.
