01.	24.04.2026	<u>Dr.YLR,J</u> Heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and the learned Assistant Public Prosecutor. Issue notice to respondent No.2. The learned counsel for the petitioners is permitted to take out personal notice on respondent No.2 and file proof to that effect. The alleged offence occurred in the second week of May, 2023. The Respondent No.2 has lodged a complaint on 02.08.2024. Nearly after fifteen months, there was no explanation, let alone a plausible explanation, for the delay in giving a report to the police. The Petitioner No.1/Accused No.2 is aged about 73 years and is a male. The Petitioner No.2/Accused No.3 is aged about 26 years old. The Petitioner No.3/Accused No.4 is aged about 45 years and is a female. Considering the entire facts and circumstances of the case, the matter is referred to mediation. Sri Tata Singaiah Goud, learned trained Mediator, is appointed as the Mediator in this case. The Secretary, High Court Legal Services	Contd...

Committee, is directed to issue necessary proceedings in that regard.

The fee for the Mediator shall be fixed at a later point of time.

The petitioners and Respondent No.2 are directed to appear before the learned Mediator on 08.05.2026 or on any other convenient date for the parties and the Mediator.

The learned Magistrate of the Trial Court and the Station House Officer concerned is hereby directed to drive the parties before the Mediator for amicable settlement.

Post the matter after Summer Vacation-2026, for Mediator's report.

Until the conclusion of the mediation proceedings, there shall be a stay of all further proceedings in C.C.No.3688 of 2025 on the file of the learned I Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate Court, Visakhapatnam.
