WHEREAS the Petitioners/Accused above named through their Advocate SRI S DUSHYANTH REDDY presented this Petition under Section 528 of BNSS/ Under Section 482 of Cr.P.C, praying that in the circumstances stated in the memorandum of grounds filed in support of the Criminal Petition, the High Court may be pleased to quash the C.C. No. 649 of 2023 on the file of the Judicial First Class Magistrate, Badvel.

AND WHEREAS the High Court upon perusing the petition and memorandum of grounds filed herein and upon hearing the arguments of Sri S DUSHYANTH REDDY Advocate for the Petitioners, and of PUBLIC PROSECUTOR, for the Respondent No.1, directed issue of notice to the

Respondent No.2 herein to show cause as to why this CRIMINAL PETITION should not be admitted.

are be and hereby directed to show cause either appearing in person or through an Advocate, as to why in the circumstances set out in the petition and the affidavit filed therewith (copy enclosed) this CRIMINAL PETITION should not be admitted, on or before Summer Vacation, 2026, to which date the case stands posted for hearing.

**IA NO: 1 OF 2026**

Petition under Section 528 of BNSS/ Under Section 482 of Cr.P.C praying that in the circumstances stated in the memorandum of grounds filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to grant stay of all further proceedings in C.C. No. 649 of 2023 on the file of the Judicial First Class Magistrate, Badvel, including appearance of the petitioners herein, pending disposal of CRLP No. 3411 of 2026, on the file of the High Court.

**The Court made the following: ORDER**

**Heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and the learned Assistant Public Prosecutor.**

**Issue notice to respondent No.2.**

**The learned counsel for the petitioners is permitted to take out personal notice on respondent No.2 and file proof to that effect.**

**The petitioners/Accused Nos.2 and 9 are government employees. Even in the statement of L.W.1 or in his complaint, there are no specific overt acts attributed to the petitioners. Of course, the de facto**

complainant and other witnesses have stated that the petitioners, along with other accused, came to the house of one of the victims.

The Investigating Officer has filed a charge sheet against the petitioners stating that they have committed offences punishable under Sections 323, 506, and 509 read with Section 34 of 'the IPC'. There are altogether eleven accused in this case. The Investigating Officer has not filed the charge sheet under Section 149 of 'the IPC', nor has he stated that the petitioners formed an unlawful assembly and committed the offence.

In the above facts and circumstances of the case, and considering that the alleged offences are punishable with imprisonment of less than seven years, the matter is referred to mediation.

Mr.Ravi Kiran Kumar Kolusu, learned trained Mediator, is appointed as the Mediator in this case.

The Secretary, High Court Legal Services Committee, is directed to issue necessary proceedings in that regard.

The fee for the Mediator shall be fixed at a later point of time.

The petitioners and Respondent No.2 are directed to appear before the learned Mediator on 08.05.2026 or on any other convenient date for the parties and the Mediator.

The learned Magistrate of the Trial Court and the Station House Officer concerned is hereby directed to drive the parties before the Mediator for amicable settlement.

Post the matter after Summer Vacation-2026, for Mediator's report.

Until the conclusion of the mediation proceedings, there shall be a stay of all further proceedings in C.C.No.649 of 2023 on the file of the learned Judicial First Class Magistrate, Badvel
