Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is filed praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue a writ, order, or direction, particularly one in the nature of a Writ of Mandamus, declaring action of the Respondent No.5 and 6 in subjecting the petitioner to custodial torture on 17.01 .2026 at Venkatagiri Police Station, Tirupati District, and the inaction on the part of Respondent No.3 in not acting upon the letter dated 20.01.2026 issued by the Hon'ble Judicial Magistrate of

First Class, Venkatagiri, whereby, directing to take action against the Respondent Nos.5 and 6 for the custodial torture inflicted upon the petitioner, as well as the failure on part of the 3rd Respondent to act upon the petitioner's complaint dated 19.01.2026 seeking initiation of criminal action against Respondent Nos.5 and 6 as illegal, arbitrary and violation of Article 14, 20, 21 and 22 of the Constitution of India and consequently, direct Respondent Nos. 3 to register a criminal case against Respondent Nos. 3 for committing custodial violence and abuse of authority, and to conduct a fair, impartial, and independent investigation, preferably by an agency other than the local police and further direct the respondent authorities to forthwith secure and preserve the entire CCTV footage along with audio recordings of Venkatagiri Police Station for the period between 9.00 PM on 16.01 .2026 and 9.00 PM on 17.01.2026, including footage from all entry and exit points, corridors, lock-up areas, and all interior portions of the police station, for the purpose of effective investigation and also serve a copy to the petitioner

IA NO: 2 OF 2026

Petition under Section 151 CPC is filed praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to direct Respondent Nos. 5 and 6, not to summon, detain, or otherwise interfere with the liberty of the Petitioner except by strictly following the procedure established by law, Pending disposal of WP 11381 of 2026, on the file of the High Court.

Petition under Section 151 CPC is filed praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to direct Respondent Nos. 3 to forthwith secure, preserve, and produce the entire CCTV footage along with audio recordings of Venkatagiri Police Station for the period between 9:00 PM on 16.01 .2026 and 9:00 PM on 17.01.2026, including footage from all entry and exit points, corridors, lock- up areas, and all interior portions of the police station, for the purpose of effective investigation and also serve a copy to the petitioner, Pending disposal of WP 11381 of 2026, on the file of the High Court.

The petition/Appeal coming on for hearing, upon perusing the Petition and the affidavit filed in support thereof and upon hearing the arguments of SRI Y V S S DHARANEESH Advocate for the Petitioner, GP FOR HOME Advocate for the Respondent Nos.1 to4 and the Court made the following.
