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Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner.

2. Issue notice to respondent No.3.
3. Learned Government Pleader for Endowments takes notice for respondent Nos. 1 and 2.
4. Learned counsel for the petitioner is permitted to takeout personal notice to respondent No.3 through registered post with acknowledgment due and file proof of service in the Registry.
5. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in similar circumstances this Court already passed an interim order dated 05.05.2026 in W.P.No.12925 of 2026 and requested this Court to pass a similar order in this Writ Petition also. The operative portion of the dated 05.05.2026 passed by this Court in W.P.No.12925 of 2026 is extracted hereunder:

“In view of the submissions made by the learned counsel for the petitioner, there is a prima-facie case and balance of convenience in favour of the petitioner. Hence, there shall be an interim direction of status-quo obtaining as on today shall be maintained by all the parties concerned, till completion of lease period i.e., upto 30.06.2026. However, the respondents are at liberty to proceed further thereafter 30.06.2026, in accordance with law.”

6. Considering the same, there is a prima-facie case and balance of convenience in favour of the petitioner. Hence, this Court is inclined to pass a similar order in this writ petition also.

7. Accordingly, there shall be an interim direction of *Status-Quo* obtaining as on today shall be maintained by all the parties concerned, till completion of lease period i.e., upto 30.06.2026. However, the respondents are at liberty to proceed further thereafter 30.06.2026, in accordance with law.
8. List the matter after Summer Vacation, 2026.
