The writ petition was disposed of finally vide judgment dated 03.08.2023 with a direction to respondent No.4 – Tahsildar (present respondent No.5) to consider the application of the writ petitioner filed before respondent No.4 – Tahsildar. 2. As is evident from the judgment, the writ petition was disposed of with the consent of learned counsel for the writ petitioner and learned counsel for respondent No.4 i.e., learned Government Pleader for Revenue. 3. The writ appeal has been filed along with I.A.No.2 of 2026 for condonation of delay of 974 days in filing the appeal. 4. Learned counsel for the writ appellant submits that though writ appellant was party in the writ petition as respondent No.9 but as no notice was issued. Writ appellant has no knowledge of those proceedings. She further submits after the order passed by this Court in the writ petition respondent No.4 – Tahsildar has passed some order in favour of writ petitioner effecting the right of the writ appellant. The opportunity of hearing	

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		was also not given by the concerned Tahsildar. 5. The ground raised for the delay is that the writ appellant has no knowledge of the proceedings. 6.
