The Court made the following INTERIM ORDER:

Notice before admission.

2. Learned Government Pleader for Prohibition Excise takes notice for respondent Nos.1 to 5.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the respondents are demanding the petitioner to pay an additional sum of Rs.7,50,000/- for license to establish permit rooms to the petitioner's shop though the petitioner is not intending to extend a permit room. If the said action is

allowed to be materialized, it affects the rights of the petitioner. He further submitted that there is no material to show that permit room is needed and in the absence of the same, the same shall be established.

Learned counsel for the petitioner further submitted that representation dated 20.05.2026 informing the authorities that the consumers will not utilize the permit room and requesting the authorities not to insist for establishing permit room. The said representation was not considered, as such, as an interim measure, prayed to direct the respondents to consider the representation of the petitioner.

4. On the other hand, learned Government Pleader for Excise submitted that the representation made by the petitioner would be considered, however, sought time and prayed to pass appropriate orders.

5. Perused the record.

6. *Prima facie*, a point has been made out for consideration, as such, this Court is inclined to pass the following interim order:

“In the meantime, the respondents are directed not to take any coercive steps against the petitioner. The respondents are further directed to consider and dispose of the representation made by the petitioner within a period of four (04) weeks.
