Chandra Murthy, learned Special Counsel for NREGS, on written instructions, submitted that the petitioner was not on duty from 20.05.2012 to 29.05.2012, having availed casual leave. It is further submitted that the petitioner again proceeded on leave on 31.05.2012 without any intimation or prior permission and reported back to duty only on 18.06.2012. In view of the said unauthorized absence, and as per the directions of the District Collector, Chittoor, the petitioner was surrendered to the parent department, i.e., the Commissioner, Rural Development, A.P., Hyderabad, on 23.06.2012. It is also submitted that the petitioner did not make any representation till the year 2019. The petitioner being a contract employee, and in accordance with the rules governing contractual service, any contract employee who remains absent from duty for a period of one month is liable for automatic termination.
