Learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that they have good grounds to succeed in the appeal. Except the evidence of the relatives, no independent witnesses were examined and no external injuries identified over the body. The deceased is a hyper sensitive person. The petitioner is innocent. Learned counsel would further submit that there are clear contradictions in the evidence of prosecution witnesses regarding the letters which were seized at the scene of offence. Learned counsel finally prays to allow the petition. The petitioner has been in jail post conviction since from the date of the judgment. Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor vehemently opposed the petition. Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor would submit that there are clear findings on the point that the deceased was harassed for dowry prior to her death. The suicide note of the deceased establishes the guilt of the accused. Learned	

		Assistant Public Prosecutor prays for dismissal of the petition. Considering the submissions made and on perusal of the material on record, since the petitioner has been in jail post conviction by the last 400 days, it is apposite to dismiss the petition by directing the Registry to call for the record from the trial Court and get the paper book prepared, so that the matter will be taken for final hearing.
