

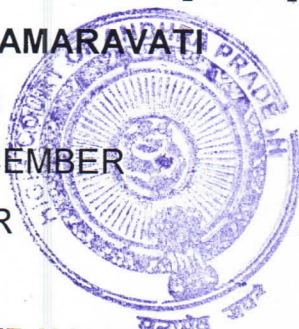

Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue Writ, Order or Direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring the action of the respondents 2 and 3 in not acted upon the complaint dated 12-11-2024 made by the petitioner against the 4th respondent is highly illegal, arbitrary, and violation of Art. 14, 21 of

Constitution of India, apart from in violation of the law declared by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Lalitha kumari's case consequently direct the respondents no.2 and 3 to complete the investigation and take action against the 4th respondent pursuant to the FIR nos. 168 and 225 of 2024 registered by the 3rd respondent against the 4th respondent in accordance with law and to pass such other order or orders as this Hon'ble Court may deems fit just and proper in the circumstances of the case.

IA NO: 1 OF 2024

Petition under Section 151 CPC is filed praying that in the circumstances stated in the grounds filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to direct the 2nd and 3rd respondents to registered the case against the 4th respondent pursuant to the complaints dated 12-11-2024 made by the petitioner's in accordance with law, Pending disposal of WP 27497 of 2024, on the file of the High Court.

IA NO: 2 OF 2024

Petition under Section 151 CPC is filed praying that in the circumstances stated in the grounds filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to direct the 2nd respondent to provide police protection in favour of the petitioners to prevent life threat /untoward incident in the hands of the 4th respondent at the cost of the petitioners, Pending disposal of WP 27497 of 2024, on the file of the High Court.

The petition coming on for hearing, upon perusing the Petition and the affidavit filed in support thereof and upon hearing the arguments of SRI V V N NARAYANA RAO, Advocate for the Petitioners, GP FOR HOME for the Respondent Nos.1 to 3, the Court made the following

ORDER:

“Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that unofficial respondent i.e., 4th respondent committed so many offences against the petitioner and his property. The petitioner presented a report to the

respondent Nos. 2 and 3 and they have registered FIRs. In spite of the same, the 4th respondent is repeating the offences, having danger to the life and liberty of the petitioner and thereupon the petitioner presented a representation dated 12.11.2024 to the 2nd respondent for providing security to protect the life and liberty of the petitioner as per law. But so far, no action has been taken on his representation made to the 2nd respondent.

Learned Assistant Government Pleader, per contra, would submit that the Police are investigating into the case registered against the 4th respondent as per procedure established by law and further, proceedings under Section 145 of Cr.P.C was also initiated against the 4th respondent to maintain peace as well as Law and Order.

Learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that since civil suits are pending, no action was taken by the Executive Magistrate in proceedings initiated under Section 145 of Cr.P.C.

Considering the above facts and circumstances, issue notice to the unofficial respondent. Meanwhile, the respondent Nos. 2 and 3 are directed to provide appropriate security as per law to the petitioner whenever he requires protection.

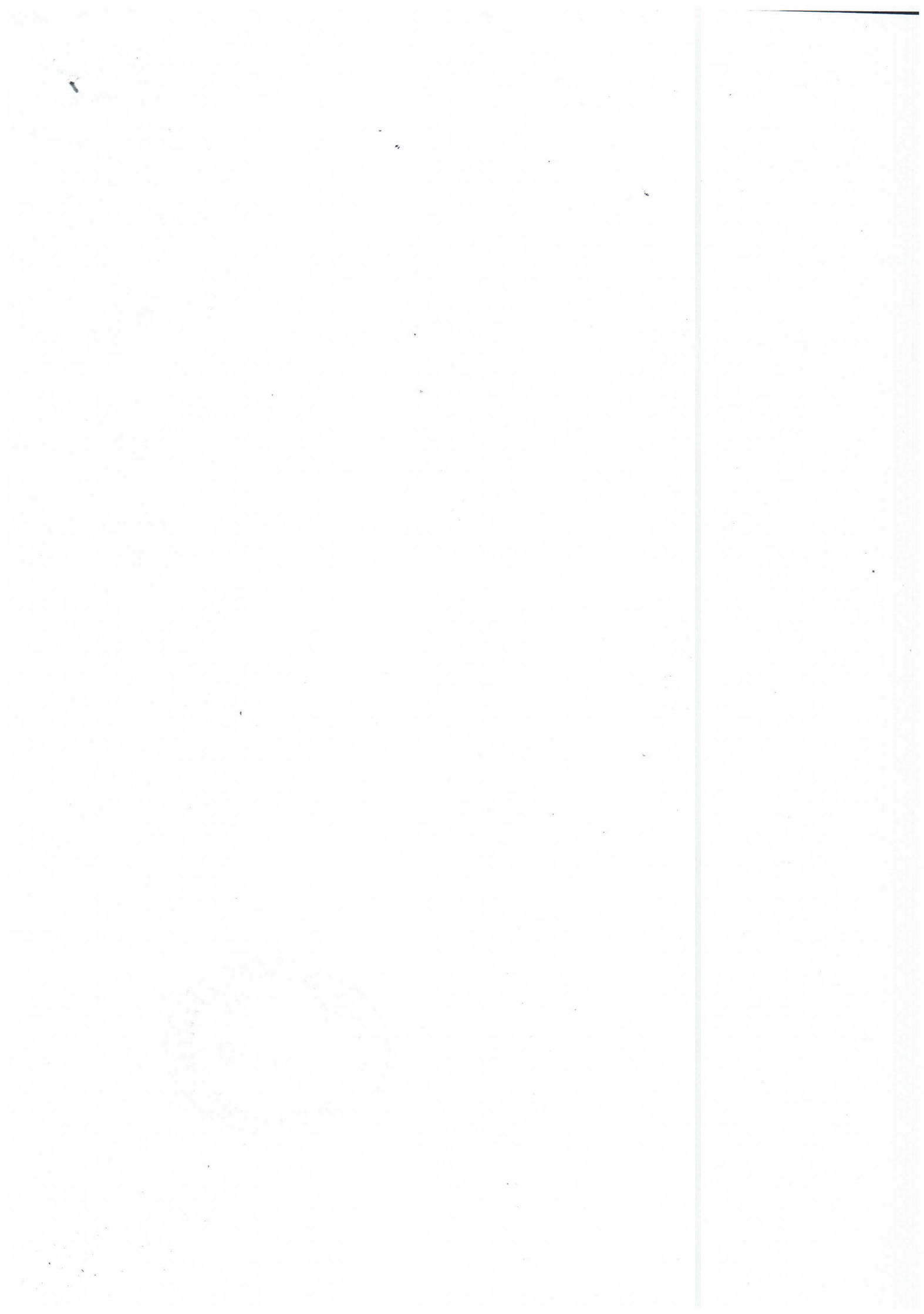
