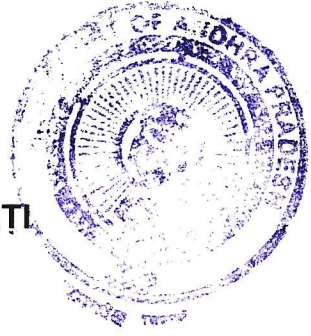

Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is filed praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue a Writ Order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declare the action of the respondents in not concluding long pending disciplinary proceedings vide G.O.Rt.No.165 Labour, Factories, Boilers and IMS (IMS and VIG) Department dated 11.05.2022 (incident pertaining to the year 2009), as per G.O.Ms.No.679 GA (SER.C) Department, dated 1-11-2008 and

G.O.Ms.No.91 GAD Dated- 12-09-2022 in spite of orders passed in W.P.No.28832 of 2022 dated 25-10-2024 is illegal, arbitrary and against the principles of natural justice and the inaction of the Respondents is against the spirit of judgment of the Honble Apex Court, reported in P.V.MAHADEVAN Vs. M.D. TAMIL NADU HOUSING BOARD and further, direct the Respondents to complete the disciplinary proceedings within 03 months, failing which the proceedings deemed to be quashed in and in terms of the similar orders passed in W.A.No.1072 of 2025 dated 07.10.2025;

IA NO: 1 OF 2025:

Petition under Section 151 CPC is filed praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the writ petition, the High Court may be pleased to direct the respondents to conclude the disciplinary proceedings within 3 months, pending against the petitioner vide G.O.Rt.No.165 Labour, Factories, Boilers and IMS (IMS and VIG) Department dated 11.05.2022, pending disposal of WP.No.30497 of 2025, on the file of the High Court.

The petition coming on for hearing, upon perusing the Petition and the affidavit filed in support thereof and the High Court order dated 11.11.2025 made herein and upon hearing the arguments of Sri Chilamkurthi Satya Dev Naidu, Advocate for the Petitioner and Sri D. Vasmi Krishna, learned Assistant GP for Services II for the Respondents, the Court made the following;

ORDER:

This Court on 11.11.2025 had passed a direction to the Chief Secretary of the State Government to submit a report regarding the Departmental Enquiries pending in the various departments as on date, along with the details of date of initiation, date of appointment of enquiry officer apart from stage of enquiry.

Today, Sri K. Rama Lingeswara Rao, Learned Government Pleader would submit that further time is required, as details sought by this Court are not readily available as on date.

The G.O.Ms.No.91 General Administration (Ser.C) Department, dated 12.09.2022 obligates the Chief Secretary of State Government to keep track of the disciplinary enquiries and ensures that disciplinary enquiries are concluded within the time specified.

Inspite of lapse of more than a month, the fact that, time is still being sought to provide the information as sought by this Court reflects that the intent of the G.O.Ms.No.91 General Administration (Ser.C) Department, dated 12.09.2022 obligating the Chief Secretary of State Government to ensure expeditious conclusion of the disciplinary enquiries is not being implemented.

As a last chance, post this matter on 18.12.2025 in 'Motion List'.

In the meantime, the Chief Secretary of State Government is directed to comply the orders passed by this Court on 11.11.2025.
