The same has been allowed and the decree of divorce has been granted. Challenging the said decree, the husband-appellant has filed the present appeal. 2. Learned counsel for the appellant submits that husband has also filed HMOP for restitution of conjugal rights and the same is pending in the different Court. He further submits that the appellant is willing and is ready for amicable settlement of the dispute. 3. Issue notice to the respondent. 4. In addition to the normal mode of service, the appellant is permitted to take out personal notice to the respondent by registered post and acknowledgment due and file proof of service in the Registry before the next date of listing. 5. Post after six (06) weeks. 6. Till the next date of listing, the decree shall remain stayed and the parties shall not remarry. 7. On the appearance of respondent, the Court will consider to refer the parties to
