2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the
present writ petition has been filed for the following reliefs:-

*I) For issuance of a writ in the
nature of certiorari for quashing of the order
dated 04.03.2025 vide Memo No. 303/ सां
dated 04.03.2025 passed by District
Collector, Saran, Chapra by which the
petitioner has been dismissed from the
service.*

II) For a direction to appoint the





*petitioner who has illegally been terminated
from the post of Chaukidar.*

*III) For any other relief/reliefs for
which the petitioner is entitled for.*

3. Learned counsel for the State raised a preliminary objection and submits that the petitioner has come directly before this Court without exhausting the appellate remedy.
