Learned Senior Counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the name of the petitioner is not mentioned in the FIR and there is no direct or indirect material against her in the chargesheet, she did not met with the respondent at any point of time and not given any assurance regarding profit to them she has already resigned from the director of Company on 12.09.2017. He would further submit that the dispute between the complainant and the M/S. Sungevity Enterprises Limited is civil dispute and there is arbitration clause in the joint venture agreement but the complainant instead of approaching the Civil court or the arbitrator converted the civil dispute in criminal one and the prosecution agency is working in biased manner. Considering the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner, purely as interim measure, it is ordered that further proceeding in Criminal Case RCC No. 43956/2025 in connection with FIR of Crime No.530/2023 for the offences punishable under Section 420, 467, 468, 471, 120-B, 201/34 of IPC pending before Chief Judicial Magistrate, Durg shall remain stayed with respect to the petitioner only, till the next date of hearing. Mr. Ghanshayam Patel, learned counsel
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appearing for respondent No.3 (who is appearing for the petitioner in CRMP No.3408/2025) prays for and is granted two weeks' time to file his power as well as return on behalf of respondent No.3 in this petition. Thereafter, two weeks' further time is granted to learned counsel for the petitioner to file rejoinder.

List this case thereafter along with CRMP No.3408/2025.
