1. The present writ petition has been filed by the petitioners with the following prayers:

“10.1 The Hon'ble Court may kindly be pleased to direct Respondent authorities to register FIR on Petitioner's complaints.

10.2 The Hon'ble Court may kindly be pleased to direct respondent authorities to investigate the case expeditiously, and provide status report.

10.3 This Hon'ble Court may kindly be pleased to grant any other relief as it may deem fit in the interest of justice.”



2. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that despite several complaints have been made no action has been taken by the State respondents.
3. We have perused the prayers and pleadings made in the writ petition.
4. Learned State counsel, on the other hand, has submitted that the grievance of the petitioners can be very well redressed before the Court below by filing an application under Section 156 (3) or under Section 200 of the Cr.P.C. (now, under Section 175(3) or under Section 223 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023). He further submits that the controversy involved in the present matter has already been decided by the **High Court of Allahabad in Misc. Bench No. 24492 of 2020 : Waseem Haider Vs. State of U.P. Through Principal Secretary, Home Others** vide judgment and order dated 14.12.2020 as well as by this Court in **WPCR No.333 of 2020 (Akhilesh Agrawal v. State of Chhattisgarh & Others)** decided on 12.04.2023, dismissing the said petition, hence, the present petition be also dismissed in terms of the said order.
5. Accordingly, the present writ petition is **dismissed** with liberty to the petitioners to avail the appropriate remedy before appropriate Forum.
