1. This is first bail application filed under Section 483 of the Bhartiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 for grant of regular bail to the applicant in Crime No.253/2021 registered at Police Station Gharghoda, District Raigarh (CG) for the offences under Sections 294, 506(B), 307, 302 of IPC.

2. As per the prosecution case on 09.08.2021, the present applicant abused and assaulted deceased Samundar Rathiya with an

Axe, due to which, deceased died during treatment in Hospital. Thereafter, the nephew of the deceased filed complain before the Police Station, on the basis of which, crime was registered and the applicant was arrested.

3. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant has been falsely implicated and there is no criminal background against him. He submits that the applicant is in jail since 10.08.2021; till date out of a total 20 witnesses, only 3 have been examined and there is no immediate possibility of disposal of case, therefore, looking to the long custody period, the applicant may be enlarged on bail.

4. Per contra, learned State Counsel opposes the bail application and submits that eye-witnesses P.W.2 and P.W.3 have supported the case of prosecution. According to the medical report, the death was homicidal in nature.

5. Having considered the submissions made by learned counsel for the parties; over-all facts situation of the case and looking to the nature of allegations, I am not inclined to release the applicant on regular bail. Accordingly, this bail application is **rejected**.

6. However, looking to the custody period of the applicant and treating the matter as exceptional one, the trial Court is directed to conclude the trial as early as possible preferably with a period of 5 months.

7. Registry shall send a copy of this order to the trial Court for necessary information.
