1. Heard.
2. This writ petition has been preferred by the petitioner under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, seeking following reliefs:-

“10.1 उत्तरवादी को निर्देश जारी किया जावे कि वह मामले को अंतिम रूप से सुनवाई कर निर्णय पारित करें।

10.2 निर्देशा जारी किया जावे कि यदि बेंच के पास समय नहीं है तो अन्य बेंच को मामला स्थानांतरित कर तत्काल सुनवाई कर निर्णय पारित करे।

10.3 अन्य कोई आदेश/निर्देश जो मामले को देखते हुए तत्काल न्याय हो निर्देश जारी करने की कृपा करें।”



3. Petitioner-in-person submits that the matter bearing Revision No. NC/RP/1671/2023 is pending consideration before the National Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission at New Delhi and was listed on 27.02.2026, due to paucity of time it could not be heard and further date was given to be listed on 03.07.2026. He further submits that on several occasions matter was adjourned due to paucity of time, therefore, he seeks direction from this Court that the National Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission shall consider and decide the matter on merits within the stipulated period of time.
4. Considering the facts of the above submission made by the petitioner-in-person and from perusal of the order sheets dated 27.02.2026, 05.01.2026, it appears that on earlier occasion also matter could not be heard due to paucity of time. Further, on 27.02.2026, matter could not be heard and it is listed for hearing on 03.07.2026 with a direction to the parties to file their brief synopsis along with citations relied upon.
5. In view of the matter, National Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission at New Delhi is directed to decide the matter expeditiously, if not possible on 03.07.2026, it shall be decided within a short span of time preferably within a period of 3 months from date of passing of this order.
6. Accordingly, the instant writ petition stands disposed of.
7. Interlocutory application(s), pending if any, also stands disposed of.
