1. The petitioner has filed this Writ Petition seeking following reliefs:-

“10.1 That, this Hon'ble Court may kindly be pleased to call the records pertaining to the case from the respondent authorities.

10.2 That, this Hon'ble Court may kindly be pleased to issue an appropriate direction to the concerned respondent authorities for allotment of the lands byway of patta in favour of petitioners, in which, the petitioners are in possession.

10.3 That, the Hon'ble Court may kindly be pleased to grant any other relief which may be deem fit in the given facts and circumstances of the instant case including cost of litigation.”

2. At the outset, learned counsel for the parties submit that the issue involved in the present writ petition stands squarely covered by



the order passed by this Court in ***WPC No.1938/2026 (Aasbai and others vs. State of Chhattisgarh and others)*** decided on **23.04.2026**. It is jointly prayed that the present writ petition may also be disposed of in terms of the observations and findings recorded therein. The relevant paragraphs of the said judgment are reproduced below:—

“5. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, the concerned Collector is directed to consider and decide the application filed by the petitioners expeditiously, in accordance with law.

6. It is further observed that since, according to the petitioners, their application is still pending consideration, they are at liberty to submit a fresh, detailed representation before the concerned Collector within a period of 15 days from today. Upon such submission, the Collector shall consider and decide the same within a further period of 60 days in accordance with law.

7. Till the decision of the application, no coercive steps shall be taken against the petitioners.

8. With the aforesaid directions, the writ petition stands disposed of.”

3. Since the grievance of the petitioner is identical to the one considered in ***WPC No.1938/2026 (Aasbai and others vs. State of Chhattisgarh and others)*** decided on **23.04.2026**, and the



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petitioner in the present case is also seeking the same relief, the writ petition is accordingly ***disposed of*** in terms of and in line with the aforesaid order.
