Heard on application for amendment in the writ petitions. On due consideration, application for amendment is allowed. Necessary amendment be incorporated in the writ petitions within three weeks. The bunch of these Writ Petitions, have been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India by petitioners who are Doctors working in Ayurveda Dispensary run by the State Government, claiming regularization of their services.
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Raju	The record of the case would demonstrate that the petitioners have not placed on record the set up their educational qualification which is required under the rules framed under Article 309 of the Constitution of India as Class 3 Ayurvedic Doctors in Class 2 posts under the Ministry of Ayurvedic and in absence of set up, no matter can be concluded. Learned counsel for the respective petitioners pray for time to place on record the relevant documents on the next date of hearing. State shall also clarify their stand that despite so many years of practice by the Ayurvedic Doctors, whether any policy decision has been taken by the State Government to regularize the services of these doctors or whether the State is ready to prepare any scheme.
