EX.APPL.(OS) 176/2026 (Early Hearing)

1. The present Application has been filed under Section 151 of the Civil Procedure Code, 1908, seeking an early hearing of the captioned Petition.
2. A bare perusal of the record would show that the Arbitral Award was passed on 10.08.2002 [**“Award”**], while the captioned Petition, seeking execution of the said Award, was filed in the year 2015. The chronology evidently demonstrates that more than two decades have elapsed since the Award was rendered.
3. Further, the conduct of the Judgement Debtor, during the pendency of the captioned Petition, has been fairly unsatisfactory, as is evident from the repeated adjournments sought on various occasions when the matter was taken up by this Court, resulting in prolonged and avoidable delay in the enforcement of the Award.



4. As is also apparent from a perusal of the Orders passed by this Court, despite repeated opportunities having been sought for and granted to the Judgement Debtor to place the requisite calculations on record, the Judgement Debtor has failed to do so, and instead have delayed the adjudication of the present matter.

5. This Court is of the considered view that such tactics ought not be encouraged.

6. In the event of failure to file the said calculations within a period of two (2) weeks, the Chairman & Managing Director of the Judgement Debtor shall file a personal affidavit, explaining the reasons for non-compliance with the directions of this Court.

7. In view of the foregoing, the present Application stands disposed of in the aforesaid terms.
