1. This hearing has been done through hybrid mode.

CRL.M.A. 2123/2026 (for exemption)

2. Allowed, subject to all just exceptions. Application is disposed of.

CRL.M.A. 2124/2026 (for condonation of delay)

3. This is an application seeking condonation of delay in filing the appeal.

4. For the reasons stated in the application, the delay is condoned.

5. The application is allowed and is disposed of accordingly.

CRL.A. 74/2026

6. The present appeal has been filed by the Appellant under Section



415(2) read with Section 528 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 challenging the impugned judgement dated 8th July, 2025 and order on sentence dated 30th August 2025, passed by Id. ASJ-09, West District, Tis Hazari Courts, New Delhi in **Sessions Case No. 58025/2016** arising out **FIR No. 326/2016** registered at P.S Vikas Puri, Delhi for offences punishable under Sections 302/307/452/147/148/149/120B/34 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 (*hereinafter, 'IPC'*).

7. *Vide* the impugned judgement, the Appellant has been convicted under Sections 304(1)/149, 307/149 and 148 of IPC.

8. *Vide* the impugned order on sentence, the Appellant has been awarded life imprisonment and also fine of Rs. 5,000/- in the following terms:

“[..]

“{e) Convict Aamir Khan S/o. Gulfam Khan is sentenced to imprisonment for life and to pay fine of Rs.5,000/- for the offence punishable under Section 304 (I) read with Section 149 IPC. In default of payment of fine, he shall undergo rigorous imprisonment of one month.

Further, convict Aamir Khan S/o. Gulfam is sentenced to rigorous imprisonment for a period of 10 years and to pay fine of Rs.5,000/- for the offence punishable under Section 307 read with Section 149 IPC. In default of payment of fine, he shall undergo rigorous imprisonment of one month.

Further, convict Aamir Khan is sentenced to rigorous imprisonment for a period of two years and to pay fine of Rs.3, 000/- for the offence punishable under Section 148 IPC. In default of payment of fine, he shall undergo rigorous imprisonment of one month.”



9. Admit.

10. Issue Notice. Mr. Ritesh Kumar Bahri, Id. APP accepts notice on behalf of the State.

11. The Registry is directed to requisition the TCR and prepare the appeal paperbook with proper indexing, pagination and bookmarks expeditiously and provide digitized copies thereof to Id. Counsels appearing on behalf of the parties, upon request. Let the TCR be tagged along with this appeal by the next date of hearing.

12. Let the physical TCR be requisitioned to the Court on the next date of hearing, by the Registry.

CRL.M.(BAIL) 135/2026 (for suspension of sentence)

13. The present application has been filed by the Appellant under Section 430 read with Section 528 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 seeking suspension of sentence of the Appellant and release on bail during the pendency of the present appeal.

14. Issue notice. Notice is accepted by Mr. Ritesh Kumar Bahri, Id. APP for the State.

15. Let the State file a status report/reply by the next date of hearing.

16. *Vide* the impugned order on sentence, certain compensation has been awarded to the victims in the following terms:

“[...]”

Compensation

16. In order to provide compensatory/restorative justice to the Victims, Id. Secretary DLSA, West District, Delhi is directed to ensure adequate compensation amount is given to the victims within one month on receipt of this order. Copy of this order be sent to Id. Secretary, DLSA, West District.



Tis Hazari Courts, Delhi for necessary compliance.”

17. Issue Notice to Secretary, Delhi Legal Service Authority (*hereinafter, ‘DLSA’*), West District, Delhi.
18. Let the DLSA file a status report as to the disbursement of the compensation.
19. Issue Notice to the victims, who shall be impleaded in the present matter. Let an amended memo of parties be filed.
20. Let the latest nominal roll along with any other relevant material in respect of the Appellant be placed on record by the concerned Jail Superintendent by the next date of hearing.
21. Let an affidavit be filed by the Appellant stating criminal antecedents of the Appellant, by the next date of hearing.
22. Copy of this order be communicated to the concerned Jail Superintendent for necessary information and compliance.
23. Copy of this order be communicated to the Secretary, DLSA, West District, Delhi for necessary information and compliance.
24. List on 2nd March, 2026 along with connected matter **CRLA. 1661/2025**.
