**CRL.REV.P.(NI) 24/2026 & CRL.M.A. 3324/2026 (seeking stay of
operation of impugned judgment and order on sentence)**

1. The matter pertains to a cheque of Rs.5,41,246/- which was, allegedly, issued by the petitioner herein.
2. Since the abovesaid cheque returned dishonoured, a complaint was filed against him under Section 138 of Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881, which resulted in conviction. The petitioner was sentenced to SI for a period of three months and was also directed to make payment of compensation of Rs.7,41,000/-, in default to undergo SI for two months.
3. Such order, dated 15.02.2025, was challenged by the petitioner by filing an appeal before the Court of Sessions. His such appeal has been dismissed by the learned Court of Sessions on 19.01.2026 and the judgment of conviction and order on sentence passed by the learned Trial Court have

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been affirmed by the learned First Appellate Court.

4. Issue notice to respondent through all permissible modes.
5. Learned Senior Counsel prays for suspension of sentence and submits that an application has been moved with the prayer that the operation of the impugned judgment and order on sentence is stayed. He states that the abovesaid application be treated as an application seeking suspension of sentence. He also submits that the learned Magisterial Court *vide* order dated 21.01.2026, has already granted time to petitioner to appear on 31.01.2026 at 10:00 A.M.
6. During course of the arguments, learned Senior Counsel for the petitioner, on instructions, submits that the petitioner shall deposit the entire compensation amount within a week from today.
7. Such statement is taken on record.
8. In view of the abovesaid statement, the petitioner herein is permitted to deposit the entire compensation amount and would appear before this Court on 09.02.2026.
9. In view of the abovesaid, he need not appear before the learned Trial Court on 31.01.2026.
10. List on 09.02.2026.
11. The sentence shall remain in abeyance till next date.
12. A copy of this order be given *dasti* under the signatures of Court Master.
