ORDER

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19.01.2024

In compliance of Order dated 08.11.2023, the original documents i.e. Term Sheet dated 10.05.2021 has already been sent to Collector of Stamps to ascertain the duty payable upon it and for its payment. Report as well as the Term Sheet has not been received from the Collector of Stamps.

It is been observed by the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in 2023 SCC OnLine Del 3598 that:

“12. Under these circumstances, it is opined that reasonable time ought to be fixed in order to enable the parties to have some certainty as to the stamp duty payable. Accordingly, it is directed that the Collector of Stamps shall usually adjudicate the stamp duty payable and communicate the same to parties within 30 days. However, if the same involves any complexity/extraordinary circumstances, the adjudication



of stamp duty can be extended for a maximum period of three months from the date of application.”

However, neither any report has been received from the Collector of Stamps nor any communication had been made by the authority with the parties regarding the stamp duty payable.

In view of the facts and circumstances, let fresh notice be issued to the Collector of Stamps to communicate to the petitioner/applicant regarding the payable duty within one week from receiving of this notice or at the earliest.

Copy of this Order be also sent along with the notice.
