I.A. 7636/2022 (u/S 151 CPC)

1. Last opportunity of three weeks is given to the defendants no.3 and 4 to file reply to the present application.
2. List on 13th September i.e., the date already fixed.

I.A. 11715/2022 (u/S 151 CPC)

3. The present application has been filed on behalf of the applicant/plaintiff seeking a direction to the defendants to file reply to the I.A. No.3732/2022 filed by the plaintiff under Section 151 of the Civil Procedure Code, 1908 (CPC) for production of bank records before the Court.
4. Notice in this application was issued on 8th March, 2022 and on 10th May, 2022 three weeks' time was given to the counsel for the defendants to file the reply. Till date, no reply has been filed.
5. Counsel for the plaintiff has drawn attention of the Court to e-mail dated 16th July, 2022 written on behalf of the counsel for the defendants no.1



and 2 stating that the reply to I.A. No.3732/2022 has already been filed. This is factually incorrect. A copy of the said reply is not on record.

6. Counsels for the defendants no.1 and 2 are given last opportunity of two weeks to file the reply to the I.A. No.3732/2022.

7. Counsel appearing for the defendants no.3 and 4 submits that reply to the I.A. No.3732/2022 shall positively be filed within three weeks.

8. Accordingly, the application stands disposed of.

I.A. 11716/2022 (u/S 151 CPC)

9. Counsel for the plaintiff submits that the defendants no. 1, 2 and 3 have filed illegible copies of the documents relied upon by them and he prays that legible copies of the said documents be provided to him.

10. Once again, counsels for the defendants no.1 and 2 has disputed the fact that illegible documents were provided to the counsel for the plaintiff.

11. The documents filed by the defendants are not on record. Hence, this Court is not in a position to say if the documents filed are legible or not.

12. Be that as it may, counsels for the defendants no.1 and 2 are directed to supply legible copies of the documents to the counsel for the plaintiff within two weeks from today.

13. Counsel for the defendants no.3 and 4 submits that legible copy of the Certificate of Marriage as referred to in paragraph 10 of the application shall be supplied to the counsel for the plaintiff within three weeks.

14. The application is disposed of.

15. This order may be communicated to the counsel for the defendants no.1 and 2.
