1. By virtue of the present petition under *Articles 226 and 227* of the Constitution of India read with *Section 528* of the *Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (BNSS)*, the petitioner seeks the following reliefs:

“(i) Issue an appropriate writ, order or direction directing the Respondent authorities to complete the investigation in FIR No. 0063/2017 dated 17.04.2017, registered under Sections 406, 409, 420 and 120B IPC at Police Station Economic Offences Wing, Delhi, in a time-bound manner, preferably within a period to be fixed by this Hon'ble Court;

(ii) Direct the Respondent authorities to file periodic status reports before this Hon'ble Court to ensure transparency and accountability in the investigation;

(iii) In the alternative, and in the interest of justice, direct transfer of the investigation in the aforesaid FIR to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) or any other



independent investigating agency as this Hon'ble Court may deem fit and proper;”

2. At the outset, learned ASC for the State submits that the present writ petition is not, *per se*, maintainable since not only the charge-sheet dated 07.09.2019 but the supplementary charge-sheet dated 20.09.2025 has also been filed before the learned Trial Court. In view thereof, proceedings are already listed before the learned Trial Court on 11.05.2026 for further adjudication.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner seeks, and is granted, a period of *three days* for ascertaining the aforesaid and revert with appropriate instructions.
4. As such, renotify on 24.03.2026.
