By way of the present petition filed under section 438 read with sections 442 and 528 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita 2023 ('BNSS'), the petitioner seeks setting-aside of order dated 12.12.2025 passed by the learned Family Court-II, West District, Tis Hazari, Delhi ('family court') in Mt. No. 645/2017, whereby the learned family court has awarded *ad-interim* maintenance of Rs.35,000/- per month to the respondent from the date of the filing of the application.

The petition under section 125 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 ('Cr.P.C.') is still pending consideration before the learned trial court; and is listed next for recording of evidence of the parties.



Considering that the impugned order only awards *ad-interim* maintenance; and the proceedings are still pending before the learned family court, where the petitioner will get an opportunity of canvassing the opposition and contentions that he is citing before this court, and in light of the provisions of section 438(2) of the BNSS, this court is not inclined to entertain the present petition, which is accordingly dismissed at the stage of issuance of notice itself.

Needless to add, that the petitioner shall be at liberty to canvass all the grounds for opposing the petition under section 125 of the Cr.P.C. before the learned family court, as may be permissible in accordance with law.

Pending applications, if any, also stand disposed-of.
