1. This is a writ petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of



India seeking the following prayers:-

- “i. Issue a writ of mandamus and/or any other writ, order or direction in the nature of mandamus directing the Respondents, their aides, agents and representatives to close the 24 unauthorised openings in the boundary wall of the D.D.A Bindapur colony and ensure that the boundary wall around DDA Flat Bindapur is continuous and running except the three authorized openings and thus ensure safety and security of the residents of D.D.A. Bindapur colony.*
 - ii. Issue a writ of mandamus and/or any other writ, order or direction in the nature of mandamus directing the Respondents, their aides, agents and representatives to motorable approach roads for DDA Flat Bindapur as promised in the DDA’s brochure as also the sanctioned development plan of DDA Flats Bindapur.*
 - iii. Issue a writ of mandamus and/or any other writ, order, or direction in the nature of mandamus, directing the Respondents, their agents, aides, and representatives to forthwith take necessary steps to restore the primary school premises and make the non-operational primary school fully functional in accordance with law, thereby ensuring its proper usage as an educational institution for the benefit of the community. ...”*
2. For the reasons stated in the petition, issue notice.
 3. Mr. Bhardwaj, learned CGSC accepts notice on behalf of respondent Nos. 1, 6, 7 and 8, Mr. Jha , learned counsel accepts notice on behalf



of respondent Nos. 2 and 9, Mr. Mahajan, learned counsel accepts notice on behalf of respondent No. 4 and Ms. Tripathi, learned standing counsel accepts notice on behalf of respondent No. 3. They shall file a status report before the next date of hearing.

4. Issue notice to respondent No. 5 through all modes including electronic on the petitioner taking steps within one week from today, returnable on 18.08.2026.
