1. This is a writ petition filed under Articles 226 and 227 of the Constitution of India seeking the following prayers:-

“A. Issue a writ of mandamus or any other appropriate writ, order, or direction, directing the Respondent Bank to forthwith grant and release to the Petitioner his pensionary benefits under the Pension Regulations, 1995, along with arrears from the date of entitlement till the date of actual payment, together with interest thereon, on notional basis strictly in accordance with the calculation sheet annexed as Annexure P-19;

B. Issue a writ, order, or direction, directing the Respondent Bank to release the detained salary for the period June 1994 to November 1996 for which he worked, on notional basis strictly in accordance with the calculation sheet. when the Petitioner had duly reported



for duty but was illegally denied joining, along with all consequential benefits and interest thereon;

C. Issue a writ, order, or direction, quashing the unilateral act of the Respondent Bank in crediting Provident Fund into the Petitioner's account on 15.06.2023, and directing reversal/refund of the Provident Fund (Employer contribution), and further directing the Respondent Bank to release the applicable interest on the gratuity wrongfully withheld from 30.06.2015 till 15.06.2023;

D. Issue a writ, order, or direction, declaring the Petitioner entitled to all consequential benefits flowing from the judgment dated 04.08.2022 passed by this Hon'ble Court in W.P.(C) 7897/2009, including notional continuity of service, pension, and other retiral benefits;

E. Direct the Respondent Bank to pay interest at such rate as this Hon'ble Court may deem fit on all delayed payments of pension, Detained salary, and other retiral dues, so as to adequately compensate the Petitioner for the wrongful deprivation of his lawful entitlements;

F. Direct the Respondent Bank to pay the Petitioner adequate compensation for the undue harassment, mental agony, and financial hardship caused by its illegal, arbitrary, and malicious actions, along with reimbursement of all legal expenses incurred in pursuing the present and past litigations.



G. Award costs of the present proceedings in favour of the Petitioner and against the Respondent; and

H. Issue a writ, order or direction quashing the Bank's communication dated 20.01.2026 and directing the Respondent Bank to grant the Petitioner's representation in terms of the reliefs sought...”

2. For the reasons stated in the petition, issue notice.
3. Mr. Arora, learned counsel accepts notice on behalf of the respondent, seeks and is granted 4 weeks to file a reply.
