1. Exemption allowed, subject to all just exceptions.
2. The application stands disposed of.

CM(M) 469/2025 & CM APPL. 14385/2025 (for interim directions)

3. By present petition, petitioners challenge the order dated 15.02.2025 (hereafter '**impugned order**'), passed by the learned Presiding Officer, Motor Accident Claims Tribunal, Patiala House Courts, New Delhi in Misc. DJ Nos. 3617/2024, 3618/2024 and 3619/2024. By the impugned order, the respondent/wife of the injured has been appointed as a legal guardian. The custody of the injured victim, who at the moment is residing with Petitioner No. 1/mother and other family members, has been directed to be handed over to the respondent/wife. Certain other directions have also been passed by the impugned order in regard to the amount lying deposited in



UCO Bank, Patiala House Court, New Delhi, in the claim petition.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the victim is 100% permanently disabled. It is submitted that Petitioner No. 1/mother, since the filing of the claim petition, has been pursuing the claim petition as a guardian and has been taking care of the victim. He submits that the respondent/ wife at the moment is living in a separate house with a minor child.

5. The learned senior counsel for the respondent/wife submits that the victim at the time of the accident was staying with his wife and minor child and pursuant to the accident the mother has taken the victim to her house.

6. On being pointedly asked, the learned counsels for the parties state that they are not averse to find an amicable solution and request that the parties may be referred to Delhi High Court Mediation and Conciliation Centre ('DHCMCC').

7. Considering the nature of dispute, the parties are directed to appear before the Organizing Secretary, DHCMCC on 24.03.2025.

8. The DHCMCC is directed to request Ms. Veena Ralli, Advocate, to make an effort for mediation between the parties.
