noticed issued by order dated 17.08.2020) & CONT. CAS (C) 198/2020

1. The Special Leave Petition ('SLP') preferred by the respondents/Union of India ('UOI') has been dismissed on 07.12.2020 and three months' time has been granted to the UOI to comply with the order.
2. On a query put to the learned CGSC for UOI, as to what compliances are pending, the response is that some computations have to be made. The Court is of the view that computations being an exercise in mathematics, on the basis of data available, should not take long. The subsequent cross-checking exercise could be completed in a couple of days or a week at best. Let the respondents make an endeavour in this



regard.

3. Another remaining element of compliance is that the petitioner be reinstated in service. Surely, the order of reinstatement of the petitioner should not take a long time. Since the SLP of the UOI has already been dismissed, let appropriate order(s) *qua* reinstatement of the petitioner be issued by the respondents. The petitioner says that he would welcome the reinstatement order as expeditiously as possible, and preferably by the end of this month i.e. 31.01.2021.
