1. Mr. V.S.R. Krishna, learned counsel for the respondent, takes a preliminary objection that one of the reliefs sought in this writ petition is against an office order dated 09.02.2022, by which some employees of the respondent were promoted, but those employees have not been impleaded.

2. Mr. Saurabh Agrawal, learned counsel for the petitioners, however, clarifies that the petitioners' grievance arises out of an erroneous computation of the number of vacancies available. It is the petitioners' contention that if the number of vacancies had been properly computed, they would also have been entitled to promotion. He categorically states that the petitioners do not wish to disturb the promotion granted to any other person and will argue the writ petition on this basis.

5. It is also stated that one of the petitioners is due to retire in June, 2025. However, it is understood that in the event the writ petition succeeds, necessary consequential benefits will accrue to the petitioner who has superannuated as well.
