1. The present writ petition has been filed under article 226 of the constitution of the India, inter alia, seeking following reliefs:

“(a) issue a writ of mandamus directing the Respondent to accept the PERC [Pharmacy Education Regulatory Charges] for the already submitted SIF dated 12.11.2025, seeking extension of approval for D. Pharm course for the Academic Session 2026- 27; and/or

(b) issue a writ of mandamus directing the Respondent to process & decide the Petitioner’s aforesaid application seeking Extension of Approval, on or before 30.04.2026, in terms of the schedule fixed by the Hon’ble Supreme Court of India, vide its Order dated 08.09.2025 passed in M.A. No. 1409/2025 in C.A. No.9048/2012”

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is an educational institution conducting, inter alia, a D.Pharm course, for which yearly approval is required from the respondent. It is submitted that the petitioner had been obtaining such approval regularly and had applied for approval for the academic session 2026–2027 on 12.11.2025, within the stipulated time, along with the requisite fee. However, while the application status was reflected as complete on the portal, the fee was shown as unpaid.

3. It is further submitted that the petitioner made several representations to the respondent through the portal and via email. Subsequently, on 16.04.2026, the petitioner discovered a reverse entry dated 16.11.2025 in its bank statement, pertaining to the fee paid on 12.11.2025, without any prior intimation from the respondent.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner, therefore, seeks interim directions permitting the respondent to accept the requisite fee for approval, subject to the outcome of the present petition.

5. Learned counsel for the respondent submits that the last date for submission of the requisite fee was 15.11.2025 and seeks time to obtain instructions as to whether the fee can be accepted at this stage.
