1. The defendant is present in Court along with his son.
2. Mr. Rohan Rohatgi, Advocate has entered appearance.
3. The matter was passed over. Plaintiff and defendant have jointly signed a document listing out the terms and conditions on which the defendant will take steps for ensuring compliance of the injunction order dated 02.06.2023 and 08.02.2024.
4. The signed terms and conditions are as under:



TERMS FOR DISPOSAL OF I.A. NOS. 40870 OF 2024 AND 16064 OF 2025

1. The Defendant will immediately cease use of all marks and packaging injuncted vide orders dated June 2, 2023 (confirmed vide order dated November 10, 2023) and February 8, 2024.
2. Defendant will immediately cease use of all marks and packaging that he was found to be using in violation of orders dated June 2, 2023, November 10, 2023 and February 8, 2024, and brought to the Hon'ble Court's attention vide contempt petitions, namely, I.A. No. 40870/2024 (filed on September 26, 2024) and I.A. No. 16064 (filed on July 9, 2025).
3. Defendant will not use any of the marks and/or packaging that he has set out in affidavits dated March 27, 2025, and July 23, 2025, and as detailed in this Hon'ble Court's order dated April 3, 2025.
4. Defendant will take down all infringing listings on the third business listing website, IndiaMart, and all infringing posts on his social media pages. A non-exhaustive list of infringing listings will be provided by counsel for Plaintiff via email.
5. Defendant will destroy all infringing goods, including stickers, labels, etc., manufactured post the grant of the injunction orders dated June 2, 2023, and February 8, 2024, except for those which are lying in his possession under Superdari pursuant to the local commission, within two (2) weeks from today in the presence of the Plaintiff's representative.
6. Defendant will share images of the revised marks and packaging that he intends to adopt with the Plaintiff's counsel within two (2) weeks from today and will not commence manufacture and/or sale before approval.

5. The defendant who is present in Court confirms due execution of these terms and conditions and states that he understands the said terms and conditions and will abide by the same.

6. Keeping in view the past violations by the defendant, the defendant is cautioned that in case there is any violation of these terms and conditions the defendant's assets will be attached and an aggravated cost of Rs. 10 lakhs will be imposed on him.

7. For now, the defendant is directed to pay cost of Rs. 50,000 to the plaintiff within two (2) weeks.



8. The signed copy of the terms and conditions are taken on record and Court Master is directed to send the document to the Registry.

9. With the aforesaid directions, these applications are disposed of.

10. Learned counsel for the defendant states that previous costs have already been paid.

11. The defendant states that he is willing to resolve the matter amicably. The said submission will be considered after reviewing compliance of the terms and conditions referred to above.
