ORDER

1. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner seeks adjournment on the ground that the arguing counsel is not available today.
2. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the respondent-wife opposed the same and submits that interim order passed by this Court on 27.05.2019 has not been complied with. According to him, in terms of order dated 27.05.2019, the petitioner was to pay 50% of the arrears as per order dated 18.08.2018 and the clarificatory order dated 24.08.2018. He submits that the same has not been paid. According to him, even during the pendency of the instant petition, the petitioner is not paying any amount towards maintenance of respondent-wife. If the same has not been done, let it be paid within six weeks from today.
3. Having considered the submissions made by learned counsel for the parties, this Court finds it appropriate to direct the petitioner to file his



affidavit to indicate as to how much amount he has paid to the respondent-wife. The issue whether in terms of the order passed by this Court on 27.05.2019 and whether the petitioner is also under an obligation to continuously make the payment for maintenance to the respondent-wife @ ₹20,000/- during the pendency of the instant petition will be considered on the next date of hearing.
