**CRL.M.(BAIL) 918/2024 (u/S 389(1) of Cr.P.C., 1973)**

1. By way of present application, the applicant/appellant seeks suspension of sentence as well as interim bail during the pendency of the present Appeal.
2. Learned Senior Advocate on behalf of the applicant/appellant submits that the appellant is suffering from mouth cancer and his health is also deteriorating as the same is also evident from the Medical Report dated 12.06.2024 of the Medical Board, All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Delhi which was constituted pursuant to the Order dated 28.05.2024 for medical examination of the applicant/appellant which *inter*



*alia* states that there is no clinical or radiological evidence of malignant disease at present. The patient has grade II Trismus and can be managed on liquid and semisolid diet. The patient has possible essential tremor with significant functional component not affecting activities of daily living. The patient is advised to follow up with Surgical Oncology Department six monthly.

3. Learned Senior Advocate on behalf of the applicant/appellant further submits that the health condition of the appellant is also evident from the Medical Report dated 25.06.2024 of the Office of the Senior Medical Officer, Dispensary, Central Jail No. 03, Tihar, New Delhi.

4. It is submitted on behalf of the applicant/appellant that there are no appropriate treatment available in the Hospital and the appellant needs regular physiotherapy and diet which are not available to him in the jail. Therefore, the appellant may be granted interim bail.

5. **Learned Special Public Prosecutor for the respondent** has opposed the present application on the ground that the appellant's earlier petition for suspension of sentence has already been dismissed *vide* Order dated 24.01.2024 and also the appellant has taken interim bail on earlier occasions. Further, he has already undergone appropriate treatment and the follow-up treatment which is required to him, can be provided to him in the jail.

6. Therefore, it is submitted that there is no ground made out to grant interim bail.

7. **Submissions heard.**

8. Keeping in view the Medical Report dated 12.06.2024 of the Medical Board, AIIMS as well as the Medical Report dated 25.06.2024 of the Office of the Senior Medical Officer, Dispensary, Central Jail No. 03, Tihar, New



Delhi and also the precarious health of the appellant which may not be easy to manage in the jail, the applicant/appellant, Jaideep Singh is granted interim bail in FIR No.89/2018 and RC No. 9(S)/2018 and FIR No. 90/2018 and RC No. 10(S)/2018 registered at Police Station Makhi under Sections 120B/193/201/203/211/323/341/304 Part-II Indian Penal Code, 1860 and Section 3 read with Section 25 of the Arms Act for a period of two months from the date of his release for undergoing appropriate medical treatment, upon his furnishing a personal bond in the sum of Rs. 50,000/- and one surety of the like amount to the satisfaction of the learned Trial Court, and further subject to the following conditions:

- a) Applicant shall not leave Delhi/NCR without prior permission of the Court;
- b) Applicant shall appear before the Court as and when the matter is taken up for hearing;
- c) Applicant shall provide his mobile number and also the mobile number of his wife/surety to the IO concerned, both of which shall be kept in working condition at all times and he shall not change the mobile numbers without prior intimation to the Investigating Officer concerned;
- d) Applicant shall inform the IO and the Jail Superintendent the address where he shall be available in Delhi.
- e) Applicant shall also inform the IO of the Hospital where he is undertaking the medical procedure for his ailment and shall keep updating the IO on a weekly basis of the treatment undergone by him.
- f) Applicant shall not indulge in any criminal activity and shall not communicate with or come in contact with the witnesses.



9. Upon expiry of period of two months, as stated above, the applicant shall surrender before the concerned Jail Superintendent.
10. The present application is disposed of.
