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1. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of College submits that
terminal benefits towards gratuity, leave encashment and provident



fund have been disbursed to the Petitioner. He, however, submits that insofar as pension is concerned, the requisite documents were not sent to the University for processing the case, since the dispute with regard to the age of superannuation from 62 to 65 years is subjudice before this Court.

2. In my view, it would be appropriate, at this stage, to direct the college to process the papers of the Petitioners for release of their pension taking their age of superannuation at 62 years. Needless to state that this would be without prejudice to the rights and contentions of the parties in the present writ petition.

3. In case any formalities are required to be completed or documents are required to be submitted by the Petitioners in this behalf, the College shall communicate the requirements within a period of one week from today and the Petitioners shall cooperate in complying with the necessary formalities. The entire exercises of releasing the pension to the Petitioners shall be completed within a period of five weeks from today.

4. List on 30.05.2023.

5. Interim order passed on 28.10.2021 shall continue till the next date of hearing.
