ORDER

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13.01.2025

1. The petitioner has filed this contempt petition alleging non-compliance of the following directions in a judgment dated 26.02.2024 passed by this Court in W.P.(C) 3445/2020:

“27. In view of our foregoing discussion, we hereby partly allow the present Writ Petition and direct the respondents to re-calculate the grant of NFSG while including the posts held by Assistant Commandants (STS) as well as the posts held by IPS on deputation. Needless to say, NFSG would be given to those officers only who are otherwise found eligible and meet the prescribed conditions and parameters.”

2. Mr. Ripudaman Bhardwaj, learned Central Government Standing Counsel, instructed by Mr. Anil Kumar, DIG, CRPF, states that the judgment involves serious financial implications and implementation is pending with the Ministry of Home Affairs. He seeks further time of four



months to implement the aforesaid directions in full.

3. Upon the specific query of the Court, Mr. Bharadwaj clarifies that the judgment dated 26.02.2024 has not been challenged by the respondents and that is in the process of implementation.

4. Although Mr. Ankur Chhibber, learned counsel for the petitioner, opposes the grant of such a long period, having regard to the aforesaid submissions, the respondents are directed to ensure that the aforesaid directions are implemented, in full, positively by 30.04.2025.

5. The contempt petition is disposed of with these directions, with liberty to revive the petition, in the event of non-compliance.
