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CRL.M.A. 20964/2026 (*By petitioner seeking directions to modify the order dt. 30.01.2026*)

1. By virtue of the present application, the applicant seeks modification of the order dated 30.01.2026 passed by this Court.
2. At the outset, learned senior counsel for petitioner submits that the order dated 30.01.2026 was passed without affording any hearing to the petitioner.
3. It is trite that a modification/ clarification can only be sought with respect to any clerical or and /or the arithmetical mistakes and/ or the errors in the said order, which may be there due to some accidental slip and/ or omission. That being so, and since this Court finds that there is hardly any assertion therein *qua* the same, particularly, which may make



out a case for such modification/ clarification thereof, there is no reason for this Court to entertain the present application.

4. Moreover, considering the time line and the previous records as also the belated prayer made by the petitioner after a lapse of almost *seven months* now, whence the petitioner was always represented all throughout after passing of the earlier order dated 11.11.2025 till passing of the order dated order 30.01.2026, there is no such reason for entertaining the present application.

5. Even otherwise, the said order dated 30.01.2026 only pertains to an earlier order dated 11.11.2025, which has neither been challenged nor modified/ clarified till date.

6. As such, the present application is dismissed with cost of Rs. 10,000/- to be paid in Delhi High Court Bar Association Lawyers Social Security and Welfare Fund [A/C 155530100009730; IFSC UCBA0001553] within a period of *two weeks*.
