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1. Even though learned counsel enters appearance on behalf of respondent nos. 1 & 3, respondent no. 2 is stated to have expired during the pendency of the proceedings before the learned Tribunal itself.
2. Notice could not be issued to respondent no. 4 as the process fee was returned under objection.
3. Upon the appellant taking steps, issue notice to respondent no. 4 through all permissible modes.
4. In the meanwhile, taking into account that the appellant is primarily aggrieved by the quantum of compensation, the learned Tribunal is directed to release 50% of the awarded amount with accrued interest in favour of the claimants. However, taking into account that the impugned award does not specify any disbursal scheme, it is directed that the aforesaid 50% of the awarded amount with accrued interest,



in terms of this order, will be divided equally between respondent nos.
1 & 3.

5. Learned counsel for the parties jointly submit that it would be necessary to refer to the LCR which has till date not been requisitioned.
6. Let the LCR be requisitioned and digitized before the next date
