CONT.CAS(C) 885/2025

1. Counsel for the petitioner alleges wilful disobedience of order dated 27th March 2019, passed by the Family Court, directing maintenance to be paid to petitioner by respondent. He states that the execution proceedings have been pending for some time and that only on 28th May 2025, an amount of Rs.89,000/- has been paid out of arrears of Rs.8 lakhs.
2. It is informed that the matter is listed before the Executing Court is 1st July 2025. The Executing Court shall take expeditious steps in execution of orders passed by the Family Court.
3. Petitioner's counsel shall inform this Court the steps taken/orders passed by the Executing Court, on the next date.



4. Counsel for the petitioner once again points out to order dated 27th March 2019, which is extracted as under:

27.03.2019

MT No. 332/2018

Present: Ms. Pragya P. Singh and Ms. Divya Yadav, Advocates for the petitioners with petitioner no.1 in person.
Respondent in person.

I have interacted with the children who are present in the court today.

Petitioners state that they have no source of income to maintain themselves. Respondent states that he is ready to pay Rs.6000/- per month to each of the petitioners (total Rs.18,000/- per month) towards maintenance of the petitioners till the disposal of the application for grant of interim maintenance. Statement of the respondent has been recorded to this effect.

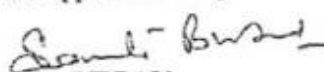
In view of the statement, the respondent is directed to pay Rs. Rs.6000/- per month to each of the petitioners (total Rs.18,000/- per month) as ad interim maintenance of the petitioners with effect from 01.04.2019 till the disposal of the application for grant of interim maintenance. The amount of Rs.18000/- will include the amount of Rs.5000/- per month which the respondent was directed to pay petitioner no.1 towards her personal expenses vide the order dated 31.10.2018 passed in the present case.

The amount of maintenance shall be deposited in the bank account of petitioner no.1 by 10th day of each month.

It is made clear that this is purely an interim arrangement and without prejudice to the respective contentions of the parties including the date from which the interim maintenance is to be paid and the amount thereof in the application for interim maintenance filed by the petitioners.

Respondent states that he and his parents have no objection if the petitioners use the kitchen at first floor of the house.

Put up on 08.05.2019 for arguments on the application for grant of interim maintenance.

5. She contends that the petitioner is in extreme financial difficulty as she has to support and take care of two children, aged 19 years and 15 years respectively.
6. She states that with the mounting arrears, it is nearly impossible for petitioner to continue to bear the daily-need expenses including education, medical bills, etc.
7. According, issue notice to the respondent on steps being taken by petitioner through all permissible modes, returnable on the next date of hearing.
8. The respondent shall remain present physically before the Court on the next date.
9. It is made clear that if arrears are not cleared by the next date, respondent shall be proceeded ahead in the contempt proceedings.
10. Pendency of this matter shall not impede the proceedings in Execution.
