ORDER

1. The present application has been filed on behalf of the petitioner seeking discovery and production of documents.
2. Learned Senior Counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that present petition pertains to the issuance of, *inter alia*, directions to the Municipal Corporation of Delhi ("MCD") to enter into a tripartite agreement/Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") with the petitioner and



Delhi International Airport Limited (“DIAL”), in accordance with the consent terms recorded in the order dated 20th March, 2024, passed in *W.P.(C) 2709/2024*.

3. Learned Senior Counsel appearing for the petitioner draws the attention of this Court to para 10 and para 18 of the counter affidavit filed on behalf of the MCD to submit that as per the said counter affidavit, the proposal was considered by the Standing Committee and the same already stands rejected.

4. However, learned Senior Counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that as per his information, the proposal with regard to signing of the tripartite agreement is yet to be considered by the Standing Committee.

5. He, thus, submits that the present application has been filed by way of an abundant caution, to direct the respondent to place on record the requisite documents with regard to consideration of the issue in hand, by the Standing Committee.

6. Issue notice. Notice is accepted by learned counsel appearing for the respondent-MCD.

7. Learned counsel appearing for the respondent-MCD submits that he shall take instructions as to whether the submission as recorded in the counter affidavit of the MCD, pertains to an earlier consideration of the matter by the Standing Committee, or pursuant to the directions as recorded in the orders passed by this Court.

8. Accordingly, let reply be filed by the respondent-MCD, within a period of four weeks.

9. Rejoinder thereto, if any, be filed within a period of two weeks, thereafter.



10. In case, the proposal with regard to signing of the MOU has still not been placed before the Standing Committee, the same shall be placed before the Standing Committee, in terms of the order dated 20th March, 2024, passed by this Court in *W.P.(C) 2709/2024*.

11. Re-notify on 13th March, 2026.
