1. This is an application filed under Section 528 of B.N.S.S. r/w Section 482 of Cr.P.C seeking extension of parole by 60 days in continuation of the earlier order dated 21.11.2025.
2. It is submitted that the parole was granted on 08.10.2025 which has been further extended on 21.11.2025 and it is expiring on 05.12.2025.
3. The health of the petitioner is still not good. He is under the regular treatment of the doctor. There is a lipoma which is slow-growing, fatty lump that most often is located between the skin and the muscle layer below the skin. It feels soft and rubbery and is often not tendered. The Petitioner has undergone biopsy on 24.11.2025.
4. The Petitioner has been called for regular check up on 02.12.2025. The medical document of 02.12.2025 has been annexed. A prayer is



therefore made that he may be granted extension of parole by 60 days.

5. The medical documents do not reflect that the biopsy has been done as has been asserted by the Petitioner. Furthermore, the OPD card of 02.12.2025 reflects that the Petitioner is fit and there are no cogent documents coating the contention of the Petitioner that he is in hospital or that he has to undergo an emergent surgery for lipoma.

6. Even if it is contended that biopsy has been done on 24.11.2025, it has been accepted even then that there is no cogent timeframe given by the counsel for the Petitioner about the expected date of the report of biopsy.

7. In these circumstances, no ground exists for extension of parole.

8. The application is hereby dismissed.
