ORDER

15.04.2025

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1. The matter has been called out. None appears for the petitioner.
2. On a perusal of the records with the assistance of Mr. Bahri, it appears that the petitioner/complainant has laid the original complaint under Section 200 of the Cr.P.C, 1973 against the private respondent nos. 2 and 3 under Section 403, 406, 410, 420, 425, 436, 463, 468 read with Section 120-B of IPC, 1860 and also under Section 63 and 70 of the Copyright Act, 1957.
3. It appears that the petitioner is aggrieved by the order passed by the learned Trial Court qua respondent no.2, who appears to have been accused no.1 before the learned Trial Court, granting regular bail under Section 437 of the Cr.P.C, 1973.
4. It appears that the petitioner had also objected and moved an application under Section 209 Cr.P.C seeking committal of the case to the



Court of Session predicated on the ground that one of the offences under Section 436 IPC is cognizable/non-bailable/non-compundable and is Sessions triable.

5. The petitioner also appears to have objected to the maintainability of the bail application, being hit by Section 437 (1) (i) of the Cr.P.C.

6. Keeping in view the vintage of the order under challenge, as also that the challenge was against an order granting regular bail, it is quite plausible that the trial may have proceeded further and may have also been concluded. The concerned IO may file a status report within a period of four weeks with respect to the status of the trial as on date.

7. Upon consideration of the material on record and after placing of the status report on record, appropriate orders may be passed by this Court.

8. Let the matter remain on the Regular Board.

9. LCR be requisitioned in the meanwhile.
