1. Exemption allowed, subject to all just exceptions.
2. The application is disposed of.

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3. We have heard Mr. Kirtimaan Singh, learned Senior Counsel for the petitioner.



4. Among the grounds on which the petitioner is assailing his transfer to Arunachal Pradesh is an order dated 23 June 2025 passed by a Coordinate Single Bench of this Court in BAIL APPLN. 2241/2025¹ which specifically requires the petitioner to cooperate during investigations. Investigations are taking place in Delhi.

5. In that view of the matter, the petitioner's transfer to Arunachal Pradesh would not leave him in a position in which he could comply with the order dated 23 June 2025.

6. On being queried on this aspect, Mr. Puneet Yadav, learned SPC submits that he would have to take instructions.

7. Accordingly, issue notice to show cause as to why rule *nisi* be not issued.

8. Notice is accepted on behalf of the respondents by Mr. Puneet Yadav, learned SPC.

9. Counter affidavit, if any, may be filed within four weeks with advance copy to learned Counsel for the petitioner, who may file rejoinder thereto, if any, within four weeks thereof.

10. Re-notify on 2 March 2026.

12. Notice is accepted on behalf of the respondents by Mr. Puneet Yadav, learned SPC.
13. Reply, if any, may be filed within four weeks with advance copy to learned Counsel for the petitioner, who may file rejoinder thereto, if any, within four weeks thereof.
14. Till the next date of hearing, there shall be a stay of the transfer of petitioner to Arunachal Pradesh. Necessarily, therefore, the warrants issued against the petitioner would also remain stayed.
