I.A. 9614/2025-By D-11 for delay 16 days in filing reply to the interim application

1. By virtue of the present application under *Section 151* of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 (**CPC**), the defendant no.11 seeks condonation of delay of *sixteen days* in filing the reply to the plaintiff's application under



Order XXXIX Rules 1 and 2 of the CPC, i.e. I.A.49530/2024.

2. Issue notice.

3. Mr. Akshay Maloo, learned counsel appearing through video conferencing, accepts notice for and on behalf of the plaintiff.

4. Learned counsel for the plaintiff submits that he has no objection if the present application is allowed.

5. Accordingly, for the reasons stated in the application as also considering the aforesaid statement made on behalf of the plaintiff, the present application is allowed and the delay of *sixteen days* in filing the reply to I.A.49530/2024 is condoned.

6. Defendant no.11 to bring on record the said reply within a period of one week. Rejoinder thereto, if any, be filed within a period of two weeks thereafter.
