ORDER

CRL.M.A. 1566/2026 (for exemption)

Exemption allowed, subject to all just exceptions.

The application stands disposed of.

CRL.M.A. 1565/2026 (for early hearing)

1. The petitioner has filed this application seeking early hearing of CRL.M.A. 36962/2025, by which he has sought interim directions to stay the impugned order dated 04.12.2025, passed by the Sessions Court, and seek protection from further investigation or coercive action. By the impugned order the Sessions Court, in revision directed the registration of an FIR against the petitioner.

2. FIR No. 472/2025 has since been registered on 07.12.2025 under



Section 420/465/467/468/447/453/456/506 and 120B of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, at Police Station New Friends Colony.

3. With the consent of learned counsel for the parties, the petition is taken up for hearing.

4. The grievance as raised by Mr. Atul Verma, learned counsel for the petitioner, is that his application for anticipatory bail was not considered by the Sessions Court, and interim protection granted to him on 10.12.2025, was vacated on the ground of pendency of proceedings before this Court.

5. The order of the Sessions Court dated 13.01.2026, clearly declined to consider the application only on the ground that a quashing petition with an interim application is pending before this Court.

6. For the present, with the consent of learned counsel for the respondent, it is directed that the petitioner may move the Sessions Court afresh for anticipatory bail, which may be considered by the Sessions Court without prejudice to the rights and contentions of the parties before this Court.

7. As the petitioner had been granted interim protection on 10.12.2025, which continued until 13.01.2026, it is directed that he will not be arrested in connection with the subject FIR until 21.01.2026, by which time he may move an appropriate application before the Special Court.

8. It is made clear that this Court has not made any comment upon the merits of the matter and all rights and contentions of the parties before the Sessions Court are reserved.



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9. Mr. Rahul Rai, learned counsel for respondent No. 2-complainant seeks change of the next date of hearing which is at present scheduled for 03.02.2026. With the consent of learned counsel for the parties, it is directed that the petition and all pending applications be listed on 02.03.2026.

10. The next date of hearing, i.e. 03.02.2026, stands cancelled.
