CM APPL. 8379/2025 (Exemption)

1. Exemption allowed subject to just exceptions.
2. Application stands disposed of, accordingly.

CM APPL. 8380/2025 (Seeking condonation of delay)

1. This application has been filed seeking condonation of delay of 10 days in refiling the captioned petition.
2. For the reasons states in the said application, the same is allowed.
3. The delay of 10 days in refiling the captioned petition is condoned.
4. Application stands disposed of, accordingly.

CONT.CAS(C) 216/2025

1. This petition has been filed alleging wilful disobedience of the undertaking given to the Family Court on 11th July 2022 and 21st March 2023 in **HMA No.1480/2022** and **HMA No. 921/2023**, respectively.
2. As per the petitioner, the parties have specifically undertaken to abide



by the terms of the settlement agreement dated 19th April 2022.

3. Part of the settlement included the respondent/husband allowing the visitation of the 10-year-old son, once every month, to the petitioner/wife.

4. However, as per the petitioner, since the settlement, not once has she been able to meet the child despite attempts and the email and WhatsApp exchanges have been appended as ***Annexure P-9***.

5. The respondent is present in-person along with his counsel.

6. Counsel for the respondent refutes the same and states that they have afforded visitation in full compliance of the settlement agreement dated 19th April 2022, every month, since that time.

7. The respondent shall place an affidavit on record, with the visitation details of every month, since April 22, alongwith the relevant timings (if available), when the visitation was accomplished, and the communication between the petitioner and the respondent in that regard.

8. The said tabulation, along with the documents, shall be given to the petitioner, within two weeks from today.

9. Considering that the respondent is present in Court, on a query being put by the Court, whether this month the visitation has been accorded, he has stated that no visitation has happened in this month.

10. Therefore, at request for the petitioner who is present through VC, it agreed that the visitation will be allowed on 04th May 2025 between 11:00 AM to 05:00 PM, considering it is the child's birthday on 05th May 2025.

11. The said visitation will be allowed near the *play area* in *Ambience Mall, Gurgaon*.

12. The respondent undertakes to provide the said visitation.

13. The reply is to be placed on record.
