ORDER

26.05.2026

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1. By way of the present petition, the petitioners seek quashing of the FIR bearing No. 0129/2023, registered at Police Station Vasant Kunj, North, Delhi, for the commission of offences punishable under Sections 325/34 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (hereafter 'IPC') and all consequential proceedings emanating therefrom on the basis of settlement arrived at between the parties.



2. Issue notice. The learned APP accepts notice on behalf of the State.
3. All the petitioners and respondent no.s 2 & 3 are present before this Court and have been identified by their counsel and Investigating Officer (IO) concerned, Police Station, Vasant Kunj, Delhi.
4. Brief facts of the case are that an unfortunate incident occurred on 19.03.2023 between the family members of the petitioners and respondent Nos. 2 and 3, which escalated into a physical altercation, resulting in injuries to both sides. Upon the complaint by respondent nos. 2 & 3, the present FIR came to be registered against the petitioners. It is further stated that a cross FIR bearing No. 131/2023 under Sections 354/323/506/34/509 IPC was also registered at Police Station Vasant Kunj (North) against respondent nos. 2 and 3 arising out of the same incident, and the learned MM, Mahila Court, Patiala House Courts was pleased to issue summoning order dated 28.06.2023 in CrI. Case No. 6351/2023 against respondent Nos. 2 and 3. It is stated that with intervention of the family and friends, the parties have now amicably settled their dispute *vide* Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) dated 11.07.2025 executed at Delhi High Court Mediation and Conciliation Centre, New Delhi.
5. On a query made by this Court, respondent nos. 2 & 3 who has been identified by the IO, has categorically stated that they have entered into compromise out of their own free will and without any pressure, coercion or threat. Therefore, they have no objection if the present FIR is quashed.
6. In view of the above, that the parties have amicably resolved their differences out of their own free will, and without any coercion, no useful purpose will be served by continuing the proceedings, rather the same would create further acrimony between them. It would thus be in interest of justice



to quash the abovementioned FIR and the proceedings pursuant thereto. There is no legal impediment in quashing the FIR in question.

7. Accordingly, FIR bearing No. 0129/2023, registered at Police Station Vasant Kunj, North, Delhi, for the commission of offences punishable under Sections 325/34 of IPC and all consequential proceedings emanating therefrom are quashed.

8. Accordingly, the petition stands disposed of.
