1. Arguments partly heard.
2. List for continuation of the arguments on 13th September, 2019 at 02:30 PM.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act, 1970 is not applicable to the petitioner which is strongly disputed by learned counsel for the Provident Fund Commissioner.
4. The Managing Director of the petitioner is directed to file an affidavit before this Court with respect to the applicability of the Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act, 1970 on the petitioner within two weeks.



The response thereto be filed by the Provident Fund Commissioner within two weeks thereafter.

5. Mr. Keshav Mohan, learned standing counsel for the Provident Fund Commissioner submits that Mr. Shambhu Prasad, respondent No.3 has made a frivolous complaint to the Regional Provident Fund Commissioner against him in an attempt to remove the counsel from the present case. Learned standing counsel handed over the copy of the complaint dated 22nd May, 2019 which is taken on record.

6. This Court is satisfied that respondent No.3 has made a frivolous complaint and has attempted to interfere with the administration of justice.

7. Issue show cause notice to respondent No.3 as to why the proceedings of Contempt of Court be not initiated against the respondent No.3.

8. Respondent No.3 shall remain present in Court on the next date of hearing.

9. Copy of this order be given *dasti* to counsels for the parties under the signatures of the Court Master.
